 - O-02-2018 Amending Chapter 149, “Motor Vehicles and Traffic”, Article II, “Traffic Regulations” to add Section 149-14A, “Speed Monitoring Systems”, to Authorize the implementation of speed monitoring systems in properly designated school zones to detect speed limit violation using vehicle sensors that produce recorded images of passing vehicles, and to specify the conditions under which a speed monitoring system shall be used, the penalty for a speed limit violation recorded by a speed monitoring system, and the mechanism for processing citations for speed limit violations recorded by a speed monitoring system
 - O-03-2018 An Emergency Ordinance to Approve the Terms of a Short-Term Taxable Loan to Purchase Police Vehicles and the Necessary Equipment for the Police Vehicles

 - Mrs. Geraldine Langford questions why there is two legislation for purchasing of Police vehicles
 - Councilwoman Eason offered that the second legislation is for two additional Police vehicles
